
ABOUT THE EVENT

EMPACT is pleased to announce the two-day workshop: Creative Sustainability in Practice: Art, Architecture, Philosophy and Poetry, organised by Nature, Art & Habitat Residency (NAHR). Join us if you would like to discover model projects and pioneering initiatives expressing the combination of art and ecological practices within the scope of Empathy and Sustainability.

The seminar takes place within the framework of the innovative EMPACT – Empathy and Sustainability: The Art of Thinking Like A Mountain, Creative Europe project.

The theme for NAHR in 2023 is 'Air: Commons, Chaotic Fluid, Inspiration'. Together we will think about literature, philosophy, poetry and the environment through the element 'Air', focusing on collaborative, critical and creative approaches to the nexus of poetics, philosophy, art, design and contemporary environmental issues we will think about artistic/cultural experiments related to ecological practices.

The seminar will include presentations and discussion panels, as well as an afternoon walk with a naturalist who will make us appreciate the biodiversity of mountain pastures and woodlands, whose morphological and ecosystem features are peculiar to the landscape system of the Orobian Pre-Alps, intimately connected to the local and evolutionary history. The event is an opportunity for different disciplines to strategically review the relationship between man and nature and how art can help us and facilitate, through its creative capacity, a commitment to change towards a more sustainable world for all species.

CLAUDIA LOSI

Claudia losi is a visual artist who never loses sight of the natural sciences and humanities, or of mankind's interactions with its environment, during her explorations, which she expresses through a wide range of art forms, including sculpture, photography, drawing, performance art and sitespecific projects. Her works have been exhibited in numerous museums, and institutions, both in Italy and abroad. In 2021 she published The Whale Theory. An Animal Imaginary, Johan&Levi and Voce a vento, Kunstverein Publishing; Being There. Oltre il giardino project won the Italian Council (9th Edition, 2020), Italian Ministry of and in Culture 2022 the homonymous book has been published by Viaindustriae.

ENRICO BASSI

Enrico Bassi is a Naturalist and Ornithologist. His efforts concentrate in the conservation of Italian diurnal and nocturnal birds of prey. For the past 20 years he had been a researcher and ornithologist at ERSAF-Parco Nazionale dello Stelvio and Parco Nazionale del Gran Paradiso for whom he has done multi-year research on the conservation of the Golden Eagle and Bearded Vulture. Enrico is an Advisory Board member of the Vulture Conservation Foundation, an organization committed to researching and preserving European, African and Middle Eastern vultures.

ELENA NEMKOVA

Elena Nemkova is an artist resident in Milan, Italy. She was born in Tajikistan in Central Asia.Coming from the St. Petersburg family of scientists, she learned to interpret the world in its tension between the most advanced scientific studies and human beings still governed by primordial instincts. GABI SCARDI

Gabi Scardi is an art critic, writer. curator and She investigates art and the public sphere and contemporary methodologies. collaborative Scardi collaborated internationally with museums and institutions, curating exhibitions and public projects. Since 2011 she has been the artistic director of nctm e l'arte project; since 2020 she is co- director of Animot review; since 2019 Scardi held the position of NAHR President. She is contributing reviews and features extensively to many publications and exhibition catalogs. She teaches modules on Contemporary Art and Public Art at Università Cattolica and IED.

ILARIA MAZZOLENI

Ilaria Mazzoleni is an architect, educator, author, and Founder. Her conceptual NAHR in the fields of work sustainable architecture and biomimicry has been published internationally. Prior to CalPoly Pomona, Mazzoleni was faculty member at the Southern California Institute of Architecture (SCI-Arc) and CalArts in Los Angeles. Mazzoleni's research focuses on biomimicry, where innovation in architecture and design is inspired by the processes and functions of nature. Mazzoleni has authored and published the book Architecture Follows Nature - Biomimetic Principles for Innovative Design (CRC Press, 2013).

JEAN-THOMAS TREMBLAY

Jean-Thomas Tremblay, an Assistant Professor of Environmental Humanities at York University, in Toronto, is the author of Breathing Aesthetics (Duke, 2022) and a coeditor of Avant-Gardes in Crisis: Art and Politics in the Long 1970s (SUNY, 2021). https://profiles.laps.yorku.ca/p rofiles/jtt/.

LEONARDO CAFFO

Leonardo Caffo is professor of Aesthetics of Fashion, Media and Design and Semiotics of Art at NABA in Milan; he also teaches Aesthetics at IULM, also in Milan. He writes for the "Corriere della Sera," holds reqular columns in "Internazionale," "Lampoon" and "Interni," and has been among the presenters and authors of Radio 3 RAI; he has worked as Curator at Triennale di Milano, was Philosopher in Residence for the Castello di Rivoli Museo d'Arte Contemporanea and is a Member of the Steering Committee of the MAXXI Museum in Rome. He directs the magazine "Parola". He has curated dozens of exhibitions, worked directly on artist installations and design museums and galleries for including the research series on the concept of huts "Cabin-Out."

MARTA TORRIANI

Marta Torriani is involved in the promotion of local culture and cheese production. Her interest started from local history to national and international projects. She collaborated on Bergamo's candidacy for the UNESCO Creative Cities network, in which the city was recognized in 2019 for its cheeses. The aim of the association she works with is to bring cheeses to the level of positioning already held by wines. She is currently in charge of organizing the events Forme and B2Cheese.

PETRA GRUBER

Petra Gruber is a researcher and educator in architecture and biodesign. She holds a PhD in "Biomimetics in Architecture" from the Vienna University of Technology in Austria and worked internationally on three continents in inter- and transdisciplinary design, research, and education, at the intersection of biology, architecture and art.

SARA INVERNIZZI

Sara Invernizzi is а museographer and writer living in the Italian Orobie Prealps. Invernizzi collaborates with the Consortium for the Protection of Strachitunt Valtaleggio and has been a member of the scientific committee of the Ca' Marti Museum since 2020. Sara is an associate of NAHR and coordinates several of the onsite activities and the relations with the local public governing agencies.

SIMONE EALES

Simon is originally from Melbourne, Australia and now lives in Lisbon, Portugal. He is studying towards a PhD in SUNY Buffalo's Poetics Program, where he has taught courses in writing, poetry, and literature since 2016. He was a NAHR Fellow in 2017, is a performance artist, and has published writing in The Music, Rabbit, Cordite, Don't Do It, and independently.

BROOKE BASTIE

Brooke is a poet and researcher based in Buffalo, New York. Her academic work focuses on contemporary American and Indigenous poetry through the lens of spatiality. She is currently writing on what she terms coterminous territories-a contested or extra-legal spatial formation that generates multiple, often incompatible, experiences of lived sociopolitical identity within the same space.

ECOPOETICS COLLECTIVE

The international visiting group of writers and poets have been inspired by the valley's air flows. Collectively working on multiple texts and poems.
