ABOUT THE EVENT

EMPACT is pleased to announce the two-day workshop: Creative Sustainability in Practice: Body Performing Nature, organised by Nature, Art & Habitat Residency (NAHR). Join us if you would like to discover model projects and pioneering initiatives expressing the combination of art and ecological practices within the scope of Empathy and Sustainability.

The seminar takes place within the framework of the innovative EMPACT - Empathy and Sustainability: The Art of Thinking Like A Mountain, Creative Europe project.

How can artists and other cultural promoters implement empathic practices towards the environment in their work? During the two days we will discuss the role of empathy in the arts as a means to activate the necessary mindset to not consider ourselves as separate from the natural world, but as part of the intricate synergies between ecosystems.

In this direction, in the year 2023, NAHR has turned its focus to the element of AIR, and its diverse functions in the natural and cultural ecosystems, to draw inspiration for artistic experimentation. By the hand of the EMPACT project, NAHR has tried to put creative sustainability into practice with 5 interdisciplinary artists who considered and analyzed this resource in Val Taleggio (BG) for the development of empathetic artifacts. We will also have the pleasure of counting with dancers from Northwestern University, Chicago USA, who will perform live.



EVENT OUTCOMES

The seminar is expected to:

- Bring together artists, cultural institutions and cross-cutting professionals form social sciences, natural sciences, architecture, performing arts and sustainability studies to figure out ways in which to artists and support professionals in connecting their work with environmental issues, empathy and sustainability in an impactful way.
- Introduce, discuss and clarify the meaning of "empathy" in arts, as well as the role of art and cultural practices in implementing empathy towards nature and non-human beings in artistic reaserch and production.
- Consider Val Taleggio as a place of inspiration. This seminar will educate/train participants who will be able to learn about model projects and pioneering initiatives that express the combination of art and ecological practices, within the framework of Empathy and Sustainability.

Join us to collectively reexamine the relationship between human and nature and how Art can put its creative capacity into practice towards a more sustainable coexistence/cohabitation.

ÁLVARO VÁZQUEZ

Co-founder of the non-profit Espacio Rojo organization since 2004, he manages projects and programs in the field of culture, education and social action.

BA (Hons) in Film & Video (University College of the Creative Arts, UK). Produces, writes and directs shorts.

Artist-Educator he has developed mediation and educational programs in Musac, Museum of Contemporary Art of Castile and Leon, Museum of Contemporary Art Patio Herreriano de Valladolid, Museum Network of Lugo, Fine Arts of Bilbao, Contemporary Art Museum Gas Natural Unión Fenosa of A Coruña, Pontevedra Museum, Art Centre of Alcobendas, Galician Centre of Modern Art and Museum of Galician People both in Santiago de Compostela, addition to 4 years as educator artist in residence with his own workshop of Espacio Rojo in CA2M, Art Center Dos De Mayo de Mostoles in Madrid.

As a trainer, he has conducted training sessions on art-based methodologies, mediation or intercultural education in Europe (Slovenia, Greece, Spain)

Guido Lanzani is an executive in charge of the Operational Unit that deals with air quality monitoring in Arpa Lombardia, Italy.

She has published papers in reviews and books, and she is editor of the volumes Weaving Culture in Europe (Nissos, 2017) and The Art of Compassion (Nissos, 2019). Currently she co-edits the book Empathy and Aesthetic Mind: Perspectives on Fiction and Beyond with Bantinaki and F. Vassiliou (Bloomsbury, forthcoming). She has also curated art exhibitions in Cyprus, Greece, Germany and Great Britain, and she is the scientific consultant and head curator of the Virtual Museum of Modern and Contemporary Cypriot

ILARIA MAZZOLENI

Ilaria Mazzoleni is an architect, educator, author, and NAHR Founder. Her conceptual work in the fields of sustainable architecture biomimicry has been published internationally. Prior CalPoly Pomona, Mazzoleni faculty member at the Southern California Institute (SCI-Arc) Architecture CalArts in Angeles. Mazzoleni's research focuses on biomimicry, where innovation in architecture and design inspired by the processes and functions of nature. Mazzoleni has authored and published the book Architecture Follows Nature Biomimetic Principles Innovative Design (CRC Press, 2013).
